## Important information

## **Change of Premises**

It's with great pleasure that I write to you to let you know that of **Monday 30**<sup>th</sup> **October 2017**, I have chosen to relocate LEAP to our new site. Our new location is **Chiltern Wood School**. However, our phone number remains the same at 07896 048841. Our primary email address is also still the same mail@leapperformingarts.co.uk. Our new premise is on the same site as The Downley School – Chiltern Wood school is the School on the Left after the roundabout where are YR 1 &5 classes already take place.

As I have highlighted in the past LEAP was not an afterschool activity for The Downley School. LEAP hired the School premises and welcomes children from all schools. Mrs. Gutteridge did occasionally work for The Downley School, but LEAP is a separate organisation.

With the change of premises please can I ask that all queries or concerns come directly to LEAP at mail@leapperformingarts.co.uk or phone/ text 07896 048841. Please note that there will no longer LEAP post box just inside The Downley School's entrance and messages will not be passed on through the school office. Please can all contact, and mail be made directly to LEAP staff. If you are running more than 10 minutes late, you must leave a message or text the LEAP phone on 07896 048841 even if we do not pick up we will check all messages at the end of every class then we can reassure the children that they will be collected as soon as possible.

This is a very simple move that will not disrupt the current classes or structure. However, please read the following:

## Yr 1, 2 and 3 Weekday Drama Pupils who attend The Downley School

The Downley School day finishes at 3/3:15pm with LEAP classes commencing at 3:30pm, LEAP teachers will continue to voluntarily chaperone children at the end of the day until their class starts at 3:30pm. A LEAP member of Staff will collect the pupils from their class teachers at the playground classroom door and escort them across the playground though the back gates to Chilterwood School to avoid car parks and vehicles.

## Safeguarding:

Please can every parent / guardian in yr 1, 2, 3, write or email to Mrs Gutteridge or their classroom teacher by their first LEAP class back after half term to give permission for a LEAP member of staff to collect your child at the end of the day on the day of their LEAP classes. This <u>must be</u> submitted as the school are in their right not to dismiss the pupil without permission.

Please can pupils who attend extra clubs at The Downley School and those who attend afterschool club also let leaders know of changes.



### **Collection and Drop off**

Please can all parents use the <u>furthest car park</u> by the Chiltern Wood School Swimming pool for collection and drop off.

## Please can all YR 1,2,3, 4, 5, 9 &, 10,

11 plus pupils be dropped off and collected at the <u>side hall</u> doors and parents congregate outside these doors or on the patio area by the Swimming Pool before and after LEAP classes. Please look out for LEAP signs. There are regular meeting still taking place in the building at the end of the day and would like to avoid as much disruption as possible.

Please can YR 6 pupils be dropped off at <u>side hall doors</u> and parents congregate outside these doors or on the patio area by the Swimming Pool before their LEAP class but be collect at the <u>Main School Entrance</u> at the End of Class

Please can Yr 7, 8&9 and Saturday Musical Theatre pupils enter and leave via the Main School Entrance at Chiltern Wood School.

## LEAP Trophies

Your LEAP teacher selects a different pupil each class



week to receive one of our special trophy awards. Trophies are awarded for: **Positive Steps** – for trying hard and having an excellent attitude to learning.

Achievement – doing something really, really well.

**Friendship** – doing something special for others.

**The Arts** – for achieving well in music, dance or drama.

Pupils will take theses home for one week and return them the following lesson, allowing another pupil an opportunity to achieve this. If the Trophy is damaged, we would greatly appreciate you trying to super glue it back together again. If you are unable to do so a replacement charge of £10 will be required.

Our aim is for every child in the class to receive the trophy throughout the year and to do this will require the trophy to be returned weekly.

## **ARTS AWARD**

Arts Award to LEAP – optional 2017/18 Bronze and Silver only.

The Aim of the Arts Award is to support young people who want to deepen their engagement with the arts, build creative and leadership skills, and to achieve a national qualification.

Through Arts Award at our five levels, children and young people aged 7-25 can explore any art forms including performing arts, visual arts, literature, media and multimedia. The award builds confidence, helps young people to enjoy cultural activities, and prepares them for further education or employment.

Arts Award is managed by Trinity College London in association with Arts Council England working with 10 regional Bridge organisations. Since its launch in 2005, the award has grown quickly and is now flourishing in arts centres.

If you're ready to develop new experiences in the arts and media, doing a Bronze Arts Award is perfect for you – this will be aimed at pupils in year 6/7/8 – and they can achieve a Level 1 national qualification.

They will attend events, research their heroes and share passions with others.

Employers, universities and colleges recognise that Arts Award is a qualification that shows your level of commitment and progress in the arts, and in developing new skills

Doing Bronze Award means they will:

• take part

in an arts activity, anything from dance to creative writing to beat boxing

- go to an arts event of your choice
- find their arts hero or heroine, research their story, and discover how they got to where they are today
- share their skills by helping to run a workshop or by giving a demonstration to others

They will build a portfolio of your ideas and activities in their own personal style and format. They might make a folder or sketchbook, a video diary or website - it's up to them. The Bronze Award will usually take you about 40 hours to complete.

Challenge yourself and build your creativity

Through **Silver Arts Award**, pupils will develop their arts skills, lead activities in the art form of their choice and achieve a Level 2 qualification - this will be aimed at pupils in year 8/9/10/11 or 7 if previous obtained their Bronze award.

Like all Arts Awards, the Silver Award is flexible enough to fit into their existing studies or other commitments, but in-depth enough for them to achieve a qualification.

Their success will show colleges and employers that you've made real progress in their art form, improved their understanding of the arts and developed arts leadership skills.

To achieve a Silver Arts Award, they will complete two units:

<u>Arts practice</u> – complete a challenge they have set yourself within their chosen art form, and explore arts events and arts opportunities within their community <u>Arts leadership</u> – plan, deliver and review their arts project

They can create their own portfolio to gain the Silver Award. Pick their own style and format – diary style, video, online, slide show presentation, or something different altogether, if appropriate.

More information about the Arts Award will be given to the pupils in the Autumn Term.

Please note that an extra fee will apply to gain this qualification.

## LEAP productions 2018



o17/18 for LEAP is show year and our 10 Anniversary! We have decided to produce two large shows during the Summer term. All the weekly acting classes will join together to present Oliver. Whilst the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Musical Theatre classes will combined to produce Barnum!

This is a hugely exciting year for the staff and pupils and will require dedication and teamwork. Both performances will be held at Norden Farm Centre of Arts, Maidenhead. This is a fantastic state-of-the-art facility boasting a Courtyard Theatre/Cinema, Studio Theatre, Gallery, Cafe Bar and Norden's Restaurant. This venue will allow the pupils three (Oliver) two (Barnum) performances for each show plus technical and dress rehearsals.

Musical Theatre is undoubtedly one of the most popular forms of live entertainment; millions of people all over the world sit in theatres anticipating that first note of the overture.

At LEAP Show year classes are aimed at arming students with all the skills they might need to appear in their very own full scale Musical production.

Giving the students as much performance experience as possible ensures that LEAP students get practical opportunities to continually improve.

Students work towards rehearsing for a full show from their very first class; building on their musical technique by doing solo and ensemble songs, giving them individual chances to shine as well as valuable skills such as blending and harmony.

Alongside this they learn dance skills with the show's choreographer and characterization and stage craft with the director as they set and shape the shows scenes and creative concept. This all results in an allround great performance education.

Who is in the Shows? Any pupils from <u>yr. 3 and above</u> who are interested in this opportunity and handed in their permission slips and show levy.

Character parts, cameo parts and dance troops have been selected from an audition process and casting has been finalized.

Of course, you don't have to be in the show, if you feel that show year is not for you or you are unable to commit to dates then you are more than welcome to only attend your scheduled week day classes. You will take part in the rehearsal process, working on all the techniques required to be part of a cast, but classes will also be split to focus on other techniques well.

If you are keen to take part in the full-scale shows you will be required to sign a permission form (please find below) and commit to the scheduled main rehearsals and pay a



show Levy. In addition to classes each cast member is required to pay a Show Levy fee. The Show Levy is a production payment of £15. The Show Levy assists LEAP with the incurred cost of production (extra rehearsals, rehearsals in the theatre, extra costumes, props, lighting, sound, set supplies etc). Permission forms and show levy payment was due 21st October.

IMPORTANT As you can imagine productions of this scale will require quality rehearsal time and planning. Therefore, it is important that students are able to attend rehearsals and it is crucial that you contact us as soon as possible if holidays have already been booked. Rehearsal time is extremely valuable and as you can see from the dates in we have tried to avoid school holidays as much as possible but it is important that the pupils do rehearse together at times (especially the younger children).
