LEAP Trophies

Your LEAP teacher selects a different pupil each class week to receive one of our special trophy awards. Trophies are awarded for:

Achievement – doing something really, really well.

Positive Steps – for trying hard and having an excellent attitude to learning.

Friendship – doing something special for others.

The Arts – for achieving well in music, dance, or drama.

Pupils will take theses home for one week and return them the following lesson, allowing another pupil an opportunity to achieve this. If the Trophy is damaged, we would greatly appreciate you trying to super glue it back together again. If you are unable to do so a replacement charge of £10 will be required.

Our aim is for every child in the class to receive the trophy throughout the year and to do this will require the trophy to be returned weekly.

We wish all the LEAP privately taught students lots of luck in their LAMDA Exams on Monday 4^{th} April.


The LEAP staff are extremely proud of every one of them - their dedication, focus and commitment is a credit to both their parents and LEAP – have a lovely experience.

LEAP productions and Showcases 2022

2022 for LEAP is show year. We have decided to produce <u>one</u> large shows at the beginning of the Autumn term. All the weekly acting classes yr 3-13 and Saturday Musical Theatre classes will join together to present **The** Addams Family Musical.

The decision to put on a largescale show again has been a very thought out and difficult decision to make. As many of you are aware we were very sad to cancel our production of Fame Jr due to Covid-19 in the summer of 2020 which also had a damaging financial impact to LEAP. We are aware that the pupils and staff are extremely keen to perform again, and we have been assessing the Covid-19 guidelines carefully as to when it would be safe for everyone involved to be in a theatre again with live performances. We also appreciate the impact Covid-19 has had on the student's education and are avoiding clashes with exam months. The show will take place on the **17**th **and 18**th **September 2022** (just before our graduating students leave for university).

This is a hugely exciting year for the staff and pupils and will require dedication and teamwork. The performances will be held at Norden Farm Centre of Arts, Maidenhead. This is a fantastic state-of-the-art facility boasting a Courtyard Theatre/Cinema, Studio Theatre, Gallery, Cafe Bar and Norden's Restaurant. This venue will allow the pupils three performances plus technical and dress rehearsals.

Musical Theatre is undoubtedly one of the most popular forms of live entertainment; millions of people all over the world sit in theatres anticipating that first note of the overture.

At LEAP, Show year classes are aimed at arming students with all the skills they might need to appear in their very own full-scale Musical production.

Giving the students as much performance experience as possible ensures that LEAP students get practical opportunities to continually improve. Students work towards rehearsing for a full show; building on their musical technique by doing solo and ensemble songs, giving them individual chances to shine as well as valuable skills such as blending and harmony.

Alongside this they learn dance skills with the show's choreographer and characterization and stage craft with the directors as they set and shape the shows scenes and creative concept. This all results in an all-round great performance education.

Who is in the Shows? All pupils from <u>yr. 3 and above</u> and **Musical Theatre Students** who are interested in this opportunity and who hand in their permission slips and show levy.

This year will be slightly different to other years as only Character parts will be selected from an audition process and when casting has been finalized rehearsals will be underway. All students will rehearse in their weekly class groups initially, only coming together with classes who have the same time slot. Later in the Summer term they will join the larger cast for group rehearsals as we bring scenes together. We will be cutting down on extra rehearsals. This will only occur for the principal set of Characters.

Of course, students don't have to be in the show, if you feel that show year is not for you or you are unable to commit to dates then you are more than welcome to only attend your scheduled weekday classes. You will take part in the rehearsal process, working on all the techniques required to be part of a cast, but classes will also be split to focus on other techniques well.

If you are keen to take part in the full-scale shows you will be required to sign a **permission form** and commit to the scheduled main rehearsals and **pay a show Levy**. In addition to classes each cast member is required to pay a Show Levy fee. The Show Levy is a production payment of £15. The Show Levy assists LEAP with the incurred cost of production (extra rehearsals, rehearsals in the theatre, extra costumes, props, lighting, sound, set supplies etc).

IMPORTANT As you can imagine productions of this scale will require quality rehearsal time and planning. Therefore, it is important that students are able to attend rehearsals and it is crucial that you contact us as soon as possible if holidays have already been booked. Rehearsal time is extremely valuable, and we will try to avoid school holidays as much as possible, but it is important that the pupils do rehearse together at times (especially the younger children). A detailed timetable will be issued

after the Easter Holidays ready for the Summer Term.

LEAP Showcases Yr 1&2



Performance Yr 1 & 2

Being Show Year, we feel it is important that Yr 1 & 2 have a performance opportunity and we are planning a smaller scale Spring & Summer production for these year groups. The Yr 1&2 classes have been working on The Princess and the Pea performance in their weekly class sessions. More than just a play the wellloved tale of The Princess and The Pea is retold through an easy script with 4 songs to give children a fun and manageable experience of performing a minimusical.

As you are aware LEAP's focus this year has been on technique and pupils in yr 1 &2 have all been given individual lines as well as songs to learn and practise. Please can we ask students to practice their lines at home, so that these are learnt off by heart.

With Covid-19 cases still quite high, especially with younger children at the moment, we have decided that this performance will be recorded and streamed to families and friends to watch. All filming and material will be completed in the last 3 classes of this term (at Chiltern Wood School) and then approved by the LEAP staff who have to edit this together to create a final product. A stream will be available to family and friends after the Easter Holidays. An email will be sent out to confirm dates and ticket information.

Costumes:


