### Yr 1, 2 and 3 Weekday Drama Pupils who attend The Downley School

The Downley School day finishes at 3:15pm with LEAP classes commencing at 3:30pm, LEAP teachers will continue to voluntarily chaperone children at the end of the day until their class starts at 3:30pm. A LEAP member of Staff will collect the pupils from their class teachers at the playground classroom door and escort them across the playground through the back gates to Chiltern Wood School to avoid car parks and vehicles.

Please can pupils who attend extra clubs at The Downley School and those who attend afterschool club also let leaders know if you are walking over to Chiltern Wood for LEAP classes.

#### Collection and Drop off

Please can all parents use the furthest car park by the Chiltern Wood School Swimming pool for collection and drop off.

Please can **YR 6 pupils** be dropped off at side hall doors and parents congregate outside these doors or on the patio area by the Swimming Pool before their LEAP class but be collected at the Main School Entrance at the End of Class

Please can **Yr 7, 8&9 and Saturday Musical Theatre pupils** enter and leave via the Main School Entrance at Chiltern Wood School.

## LEAP Trophies

each class week to receive one of our special trophy awards. Trophies are awarded for:  
**Positive Steps** – for trying hard and having an excellent attitude to learning.

**Achievement** – doing something really, really well.

**Friendship** – doing something special for others.

**The Arts** – for achieving well in music, dance or drama.

Pupils will take these home for one week and return them the following lesson, allowing another pupil an opportunity to achieve this. If the Trophy is damaged, we would greatly appreciate you trying to super glue it back together again. If you are unable to do so a replacement charge of £10 will be required.

Our aim is for every child in the class to receive the trophy throughout the year and to do this will require the trophy to be returned weekly.

## Extra Opportunities for LEAP students



### ARTS AWARD

Arts Award to LEAP – optional 2018/19 Bronze and Silver only.

The Aim of the Arts Award is to support young people who want to deepen their engagement with the arts, build creative and leadership skills, and to achieve a national qualification.

Through Arts Award at our five levels, children and young people aged 7-25 can explore any art forms including performing arts, visual arts, literature, media and multimedia. The award builds confidence, helps young people to enjoy cultural activities, and prepares them for further education or employment.

Arts Award is managed by Trinity College London in association with Arts Council England working with 10 regional Bridge organisations. Since its launch in 2005, the award has grown quickly and is now flourishing in arts centers.

If you're ready to develop new experiences in the arts and media, doing a Bronze Arts Award is perfect for you – this will be aimed at pupils in year 6/7/8 – and they can achieve a Level 1 national qualification.

They will attend events, research their heroes and share passions with others.

Employers, universities and colleges recognise that Arts Award is a qualification that shows your level of commitment and progress in the arts, and in developing new skills

Doing Bronze Award means they will:

- take part in an arts activity, anything from dance to creative writing to beat boxing
- go to an arts event of your choice
- find their arts hero or heroine, research their story, and discover how they got to where they are today
- share their skills by helping to run a workshop or by giving a demonstration to others

They will build a portfolio of your ideas and activities in their own personal style and format. They might make a folder or sketchbook, a video diary or website - it's up to them. The Bronze Award will usually take you about 40 hours to complete.

Challenge yourself and build your creativity

Through **Silver Arts Award**, pupils will develop their arts skills, lead activities in the art form of their choice and achieve a Level 2

qualification - this will be aimed at pupils in year 8/9/10/11 or 7 if previous obtained their Bronze award.

Like all Arts Awards, the Silver Award is flexible enough to fit into their existing studies or other commitments, but in-depth enough for them to achieve a qualification.

Their success will show colleges and employers that you've made real progress in their art form, improved their understanding of the arts and developed arts leadership skills.

To achieve a Silver Arts Award, they will complete two units:

Arts practice – complete a challenge they have set yourself within their chosen art form, and explore arts events and arts opportunities within their community

Arts leadership – plan, deliver and review their arts project

They can create their own portfolio to gain the Silver Award. Pick their own style and format – diary style, video, online, slide show presentation, or something different altogether, if appropriate.

More information about the Arts Award will be given to the pupils in the Autumn Term.

Please note that an extra fee will apply to gain this qualification.

As many of you know LAMDA is an extra-curricular activity that benchmarks students ability, providing independent professional accreditations.

This year participation is on a first come first serve basis to ensure LEAP's own technique based learning syllabus can be met. We have listened to the feedback and recognise that our own lessons had become too biased towards LAMDA, which is not why this option was made available.

If you wish to continue LAMDA based learning, please read on carefully to ensure you don't miss out. But first lets remind ourselves all about Lamda.

The London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA) is one of the oldest drama schools in the United Kingdom. Founded in 1861, it quickly established itself as a centre of excellence in performance training. LAMDA has provided theatre and the world of film and television with generation upon generation of first-class actors and expertly-trained stage managers across the world.

As an extra to LEAP classes, pupils in the above classes must opt-in to work towards their LAMDA exams this academic year ranging from Grade 2 to Gold Medal Acting or Musical Theatre syllabuses.

Pupils interested in opting in LAMDA Examinations must read the booklet attached and complete the forms at the back of the pack and return to your LEAP class teacher

**Craft session** will complete the morning as you make some themed memorabilia to take home with you.



## Outing –Woman in Black show and workshop!

**Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> October**

To All Pupils Drama Yr. **10 plus and Senior Musical Theatre**

LEAP is delighted to announce an outing to see **Woman in Black at London's Fortune Theater.**

Requests will be on a first come first served basis and payment must be made **cash by Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> October.**

As the second longest running play in the West End, *The Woman in Black* is sure to petrify audiences from beginning to end. With its unique use of illusion and the suspense of controlled horror, *The Woman in Black* is a highly memorable theatrical treat.

This West End classic has been watched from behind the hands of over seven million theatregoers on the claustrophobic stage of the Fortune Theatre. The story holds the advantage of a timeless original story that, although written in 1983, still holds the ability to shock and frighten a modern audience.

Its use of only two actors and the overall simplicity of its presentation, harks back to its humble stage origins, while also having the effect

of building a tension that will chill audiences to the bone.

However, the fun doesn't stop there we have also arranged a **Woman in Black workshop!!**

Brand new GCSE and A-Level workshops for **The Woman in Black**

Led by theatre professionals, this new workshop will take students into the Fortune Theatre and onto the actual set to explore and experience what makes this ghostly tale one of the most successful West End shows ever. Designed with the GCSE and A-Level Theatre and English syllabuses in mind they will maximise students' experience of watching **The Woman in Black** through practical examination and investigation of the play's core themes.

Students will examine the mechanics that make the play such an effective piece of theatre: how **The Woman in Black** creates tension; sharpening students' literary and drama analysis skills; identifying how the production engages to make an audience feel unnerved. Playing with imaginative and resourceful storytelling techniques, students will explore how the performers work with text, set, and each other to tell a story. Above all, these workshops will encourage students to participate, be brave and creative and in so doing build confidence in their own ideas.


